Mapping Ideas for your Mixed Ability Classes

Knowing your class is key to getting the most from your students. It helps to plan and create the best learning opportunities. Check out the simple ideas for mapping you class below and use the Small Talk video as a reference point.

Procedure:

- 1. Download the 'Mixed Ability Class Mapping" pdf
- 2. After each of your first 2-3 classes, write down where each of students fit on the maps
- 3. Add your own parameters that relate to your teaching context
- 4. Share with any co-teachers teaching the same class
- Reassess after 4-5 classes and end of course
- 6. Plan your grouping and activities accordingly.

Using a Learner Profile

The attached Learner Profile document will help to gain a deeper understanding of your class. The longer you spend on this at the beginning of a semester the better you will be able to cater to your whole class. This also is very useful when a teacher takes over your class to give them a solid background of who they will be teaching.

Procedure:

- 1. Download the 'Learner Profile Template Macmillan Education" pdf or word doc
- 2. Try to meet your students before you begin the first class.
- Individually or in groups of 2- have an open discussion and use the template as a guide
- 4. After a few lesson continue to add more detail
- 5. Remember to focus on observed behavior form the class.
- 6. Taking a few minutes after each class to add to your learner profiles.
