

### **STRATEGY 2: Personal progress chart**







Ask pupils to draw a table listing their goals. Add a row for each week of the course. Encourage them to tick which goals have been met each week.



Every week, ask pupils to write two sentences, responding to the following prompts: What do I understand better this week? Write one to two things you hope to achieve by next week.

### **STRATEGY 1: Applying positive psychology**





Ask pupils to make a list of what they CAN DO well in English



Writing exercise: Change negative thoughts into positive statements



Speaking exercise: What would you say to a learner struggling with these doubts?



Fixed mindset vs. growth mindset exercises: Scenariobased reactions

## **STRATEGY 3: Share success stories**





Personal experience: Ask pupils to talk about people they know who have learned a foreign language.



Reading material: Choose texts about inspiring language learners in business, pop culture, etc.



Invite speakers: Host talks given by language learners about their achievements



Jobs board: Share a digital jobs board with opportunities that require languages.

# **STRATEGY 4: Grammar through visualization**



- Visualize situations in which different tenses would be used
- Write about personal ambition using phrasal verbs: In the future, I will take on a job that requires English.
