Good thinking — "fast" is a bit informal for a report. Can you think of a more formal synonym for "fast that would fit better in this context?

Clue: It starts with "r" and is often used in academic writing to describe quick changes.

Exactly — "rapid" is a much better fit here! So now your sentence could be:

"In the modern world, communication is changing rapidly."

Nice job spotting that!
















- Self-assessment can boost student learning when done well
