BIAS

Bias is the tendency to believe that some people, ideas or things are better than others.

It's normal to have biases, but they can stop us from treating each other fairly and can lead to prejudice.

PREJUDICE

A **prejudice** is an opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience.

An example of **prejudice** is when people dislike another group of people who are different from them, because of things like their skin colour, religion or nationality.

A lot of the time we don't even know we have a **bias** or a **prejudice**. It's important to understand them so we can challenge them, and so we don't treat people unfairly because of them.
