WHY USE SONGS IN CLASS

- They are fun and easy to remember
- They develop listening skills
- They are a great way to practise vocabulary and language in context
- They help children remember the correct pronunciation
- They help build children's confidence

WHEN TO USE SONGS IN CLASS

- As part of your learning routine
- To practise and recycle language and vocabulary
- To make a link to a story or other content
- To reinforce positive values, e.g. kindness
- To introduce traditional children's culture, such as singing traditional songs

5 FUN ACTIVITIES TO USE WITH SONGS IN CLASS

- 1. Stick flashcards on walls around the classroom or put them on screen. Get children to listen and point to the flashcards when they hear the words in the song.
- 2. Ask children to do an action when they hear the words, e.g. jump up, wave their arms, etc.
- 3. When they are familiar with the song, get children to act it out and sing along.
- 4. Divide the class into groups (one for each character) and get them to sing and act out different lines.
- 5. Get children to suggest ideas for new verses of the song using words from the same vocabulary set that they already know.



TOP TIP: When you want to introduce a new song, play the whole song several times in different lessons. Children will listen and start to understand and will then join in when they are ready to do so.
